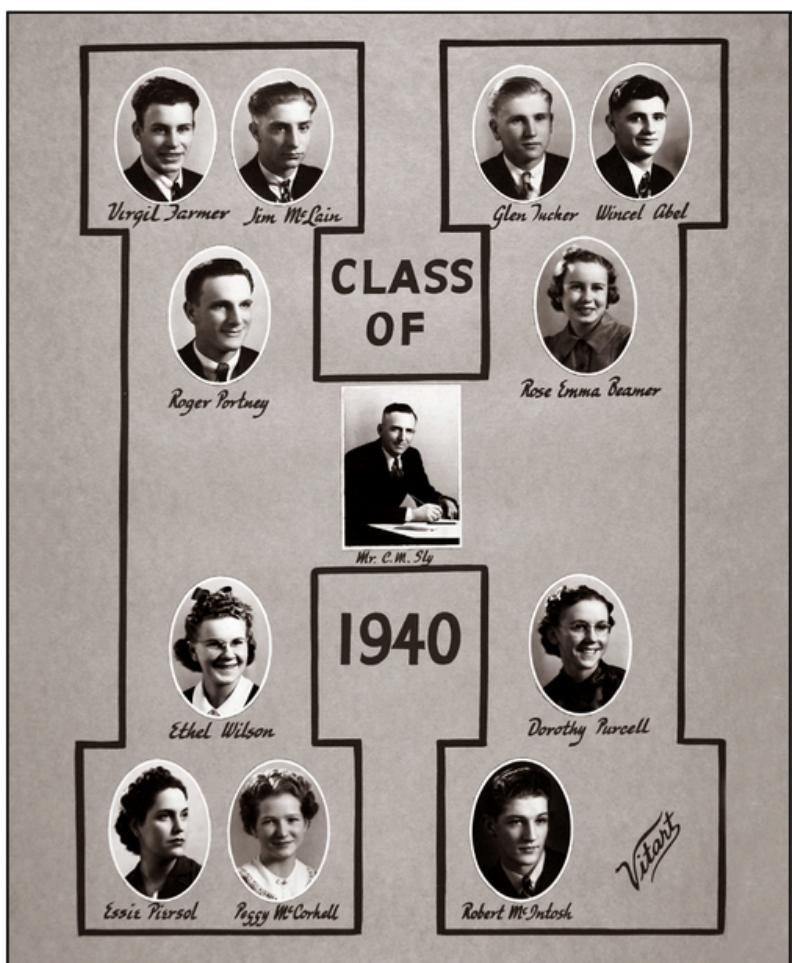

Children's books are endlessly amusing, entertaining, and insightful, and the day the new children's books come in the order is the happiest day of the month. This month was no exception, we received some very good titles. Let's look them over.

Hap-Pea Valentine's Day by Keith Baker. A further foray into the world of peas, now 10 books long. *LMNO Peas* was a tour-de-force of rhymes, colors, and the alphabet. This one is about Valentine's Day candy and activities. Same old silly peas, though.

The Bakery Dragon by Devin Elle Kurtz. Beautiful illustrations are the entry point of this nice little story, but the wood-burning oven bakery in the picturesque little village is very important as well. Sharing is the message.

We Are Definitely Human by X. Fang. Three strangers need help in a small rural town. The kind people of the town help them repair their conveyance. Everyone is sure human.
