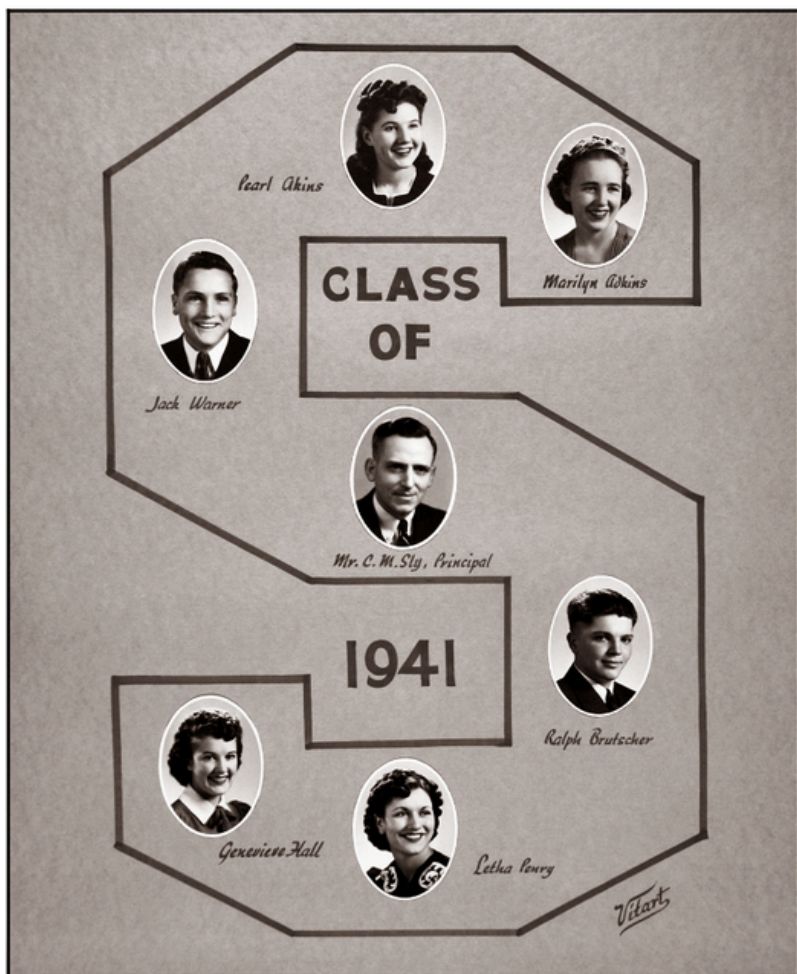

What's a Podcast?

Well, it's like a radio show you can listen to any time you want. It's not broadcast by a radio station, you have to go to the internet, find it, and play it. Podcasts are available from an almost endless number of people, agencies, and performance groups. They are on an almost endless number of topics. There are poetry podcasts, there are history podcasts, there are astronomy podcasts. Many podcasts are fiction, either in the one-episode short form, or in the several-episode long story arc form. There are podcasts about soap operas, podcasts about water treatment, podcasts about old radio shows. Any interest you have, there is a podcast for you.

Podcasts are located on the internet. If you have a smart phone, you can find the app that works best for your device and use it to get podcasts. If you don't feel comfortable with that, you can find a podcast's website and listen to it there. The Weston Library's podcast is called OutWeston. You can find it on Spotify, a website that hosts podcasts for free. You can listen to it there, but they do want you to sign up for an account with them. You don't have to put in a credit card, and it's free as long as you don't mind listening to their advertisements. The Library does not get any money from those advertisements. You can also go to Apple Podcasts online and listen there. They want you to have an account with them, too.

Now, I would very much like for you to make an account on one of these platforms, subscribe to the podcast, listen to it every week, tell your friends and family to do the same, and then comment on it and rate it 5 out of 5 stars. I do understand that seems very hard to anyone who has only just learned of the podcast's existence. You can just listen to the new episodes, they come out on Saturday afternoons at 2pm. A reminder is published on Facebook a few minutes later, with a link to the podcast. It's okay to listen to it that way, every listen shows up on our statistics. Listen to it, it's fun!

Really, I would like you to subscribe to it on several platforms. I would like you to make up many different emails and subscribe to it on several platforms from every new email, rating the podcast 5 stars in every instance. But the most important thing of all is for you to come be on the podcast yourself. I really do want everyone to be on it.
